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### THURSDAY, JULY 12, 2007

THE COURT: This is DR-07-331(C), In Re the Marriage of Haywood.

The purpose of this hearing is in -- on July 3rd pursuant to an affidavit and request by Petitioner, Chris Haywood, the Court granted him temporarily the custody of the minor child that's at issue in this case. Immediately thereafter there was a competing affidavit filed by the Respondent, Jamie Haywood, alleging that not only were the facts in Mr. Haywood's affidavit incorrect but the child was put at risk by being placed with Mr. Haywood.

The purpose of this hearing is to go through these affidavits to establish which of them are true. If both of them are true the Court will have to determine where the child should be placed so as not to put this child at risk.

Anybody who is planning on testifying today will have to wait outside the courtroom other than the parties. And the Petitioner, I guess it's -- it's your affidavit, you can state why you feel that the Court should not vacate its temporary order pursuant to the request of the Respondent. And you may proceed.

MS. JOHNSON-GILCHRIST: All right, Your Honor.

MR. MOORE: I would want to remove at least one person that I know is going to testify.

(Off the record.)

THE COURT: You may --

(Off the record.)

MR. MOORE: Thank you.

THE COURT: All right, Your Honor. The first witness I will call will be Devra West. And Devra if you would step forward, please, raise your righthand, be sworn in and then take a seat on the witness stand.

Thereupon,

#### DEVRA WEST,

a witness of lawful age, having been first duly sworn to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth, testified upon her oath as follows:

(Off the record.)

#### DIRECT EXAMINATION

#### BY MS. JOHNSON-GILCHRIST:

- Q. Would you state your name for the record, please?
  - A. Devra Lynn Patton West.
  - Q. And, Devra, where do you reside?
  - A. Lakeside, Colo -- Lakeside, Montana.
  - Q. And how long have you resided there?

- A. Um, approximately two years --
- Q. And --
- A. -- heading towards September, two years.
- Q. All right. And what is your occupation?
- A. I'm a business owner in the Lakeside area.
- Q. And what is the nature of your business?
- A. I have four companies, one of which is a real estate L.L.C. The other company is a health and healing management company that is Surya Unlimited Enterprises. I have a third company which is Millennium Mind which does concept development and image branding for entrepreneurial companies. And my last company is a sole proprietorship Fire of Mind which umbrellas my intellectual materials.
- Q. All right. Um, have you had an opportunity to review the affidavit of Jamie Haywood in this matter?
  - A. Um, very briefly I reviewed it.
- Q. Okay. And first of all, um, what is your relationship to the Petitioner, Chris Haywood?
  - A. His mother.
  - Q. And Jamie would be your daughter-in-law?
  - A. Correct.
- Q. And how long have you been acquainted with Jamie?

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- Um, I believe that I first met her perhaps four or five years ago, I'm guessing.
- And Jamie has been married to your son Chris Q. for approximately one year?
  - Correct.
- Okay. Now, in the affidavit filed by Jamie Q. herein, are you aware that it has been alleged by her that you operate a cult?
- Correct, I'm aware that she has alleged that rather fantastic accusation.
- And what is your response to stating that you Q. operate a cult?
- Um, my response is that it's ridiculous and absolutely not true or possible.
- And in fact what does your business do that Ο. would lead her in any way to allege such a thing?
- Um, there's nothing in my companies that could possibly be linked with any sort of commentary along those lines whatsoever. Um, there is no group organized anywhere, there is no location, there's no meeting of any group.

My companies distribute, um, meditation guided CDs, books, stress reduction and healing guided CDs. And so the company is primarily an internet distribution of my intellectual materials.

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- And would you refer to the packet in front of Q. you and what is marked as Petitioner's Exhibit No. 6?
  - Α. Okay --
- No, the -- the pack -- this packet, I'm Q. sorry.
  - Α. Oh, okay.
  - Q. Uh-huh.
  - Yes. Α.
  - And what is the first page of this document? Q.
- Α. Um, this is my background -- my professional background.
- Okay. And is this something that's published Ο. or that anyone could access online?
  - Yes, it is. Α.
- Okay. And referring to page number 3, what is this -- can you identify that?
- Um, this is a -- number 3, is -- it is in my -- my paperwork is the sentencing of Ladean Miscampbell or Sissy Miscampbell.
- No -- no, I'm sorry, the third page of Q. Exhibit 6.
- Oh, third page of Exhibit 6, sorry. Um, this is a, um, course syllabus -- front page of a brochure of a women's leadership course that I taught -- cotaught with Robin Fisher Roffer who was one of the

brand strategists for CNN. So it essentially was, um, taking CEOs or women leaders and helping to cultivate their brand strategy -- their brand and image as professionals.

- Q. And, um, two pages later in this, what is this entitled "The Globial Peace Initiative of Women," what is this?
- A. Um, this is an organization that moved out of the Millenia 2000 which was held in New York City. I believe it was convened and funded by Ted Turner.

  Because there was so little women's representation at that symposium in New York City, a second symposium moved out of that. It was held in Geneva, Switzerland at the United Nations. Um, I was a speaker at that symposium and I was invited as one of the 500 most influential women in the humanitarian and spiritual domain globally. So this is a -- particular thing is a letter to me regarding a -- a new symposium that will be held in Jaipur, India in March of 2008 and would I be willing to join them and participate in the symposium again.
  - Q. And do you intend to?
- A. Um, very likely, I've just received this a few days ago. I've done quite a bit of work with this group in regions of conflict.

- Q. And the next pages of photographs, just very quickly what are these photographs from?
- A. Um, I participated in a humanitarian and, um, peace efforts in the middle east for some nine years. This particular photo is of myself conducting and hosting a peace promise initiative wherein we assembled Arabs, Jews, Christians and so on primarily from the academic and political somewhat from the spiritual domains of the society there. This assembled some 800 individuals, 300 of the individuals were representatives from the American Ministerial Association, there's congressmen here from the United States there, ambassadors, um, you know, very influential people for the most part participating.
- Q. Okay. On the last page of this exhibit -first of all let me ask you some questions. Is it fair
  to characterize your company as a multi-billion dollar
  enterprise?
  - A. Correct.
- Q. And is it part of your philosophy to make philanthropic contributions both nationally, statewide, locally and internationally?
- A. Absolutely. I have spent the last 20 years of my life as a highly prolific and successful individual and probably donating well over 70 percent

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of my income to various humanitarian, peace projects and efforts and so forth globally.

- Ο. And the last page, is this a copy of some of your -- or of your philanthropic contributions for 2002 throughout 2005?
  - Α. Correct, correct.
  - From your own books? Q.
  - Α. Correct.
- Okay. And contributing both nationally and Q. even locally such as the Bigfork school?
- Correct. When I first came up here and I Α. moved here largely for the beauty, the winter sports, the water sports, and so on, and certainly for the real estate values that I thought were very attractive at the time.

And in February of 2004 I was invited by the Bigfork Rotary Club to give a keynote address to their assembly on creative fundraising.

Um, I come from a family that is very philanthropic in background. Um, my father has worked with Colin Powell to develop the Red Wagon Program which is primarily, um, seated in the southeastern part of the United States right now.

Um, my oldest --

A. Beautiful office in Lakeside, yes. 21 Do you have any people that live there full 22 Q. time and --23 I have paid employees only, none of whom are 24 Α. direct participants in any of the materials, they 25

simply do their job.

- Q. Okay. Now it -- there's also allegations that you reside with your son, that your house is being foreclosed on and you're being evicted and --
  - A. Right, I've heard these stories --
- Q. -- therefore your granddaughter would have no place to live, is that accurate?
  - A. Absolutely not accurate.
- Q. Okay. And regarding the house in which your son resides --
  - A. Correct.
- Q. -- and was the marital residence of he and Jamie?
  - A. Correct.
- Q. Um, approximately -- where is the house located and could you describe it briefly?
- A. It's located at 525 Political Hill Road in the Peaceful Bay area of Lakeside.
  - Q. And do you reside there?
  - A. No, I do not.
  - Q. And where do you reside?
  - A. 38 Bayview which three lots from that home.
- Q. Okay. And is this home still -- are you in the process of purchasing the home?
  - A. Um, I'm happy to explain the situation.

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- Q. You don't need to, just are you in the process of purchasing it?
- Yes, it's under a contract, I'm still in provisions of the contract. There was a, um, nondisclosure on well rights, waterfront frontage and an easement that we were in dispute for some two months on the property which delayed our closing.
  - ο. And --
- But I have began with a lease option so my furnishings and everything are in the home and still remain in the home.
- Okay. And in the home Chris is in, how many bedrooms is it?
  - Um, three upstairs and one downstairs. Α.
- Okay. And is that home going to continue to 0. be available to him to reside in --
  - Α. Absolutely.
  - -- along with the children? Q.
  - Absolutely. Α.
  - Okay. Is Chris on salary from your company? Q.
  - Α. Yes, he is.
  - And what is his annual salary? Q.
  - The annual salary is \$50,000 per year. Α.
- And is he able to perform the work he does Q. for your company from his home?

- A. Um, yes indeed, he best be doing it though.
- Q. And is that in fact what he has primarily been doing?
- A. Yes, he arranges, um, and supervises contractors so that when we're doing property development or property maintenance -- we have, um, a multi-million dollar property presently that he has actually been the manager for -- for probably three or four years. So much of what he does is on the phone and in his home office arranging and supervising building contractors.
- Q. Is he able to arrange that for the most part around the children's schedule to provide their care while he's at home?
- A. Um, I don't see why not, I'm sure that he does. It doesn't matter to us how or when he conducts his hours as long he produces the project management.
  - Q. And about how many hours a week does he work?
- A. I'm estimating between 20 and 30 hours a week.
- Q. Okay. And, um, regarding the time periods since Chris obtained -- or he and Jamie married a year ago, and -- and after Sasha was born --
  - A. Uh-huh.
  - Q. -- approximately a year ago.

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- Α. Correct.
- Has Chris been involved in daily care of ο. Sasha?
- Oh, absolutely. Um, that's certainly what I Α. witnessed and I know that Jamie did go back to work when the child was about three months old. Jamie tends to, um, be somewhat restless and wants to be out and about quite a bit and so she really has not been in the home with the kind of regularity that you would expect from most young mothers.
  - Who cared for the baby while Jamie was --Q.
  - My son did. Α.
  - -- gone. Q.

And in your observations of Chris, does he provide appropriate care for your granddaughter?

- I think he's one of the most beautiful fathers and if he wasn't, he would certainly have to answer to me.
  - Do you have other grandchildren?
  - Yes, I do. I have five grandchildren.
- And is there a third party caregiver involved other than Jamie or Chris on a regular basis -- or has there been?
  - Α. No.
  - Okay. And regarding the allegations that, on Q.

your personal knowledge, what have you observed about any difference in behavior since Jamie went back to work about -- or after Sasha was born? Could you please relate to the Court what you have observed?

A. Right. What I observed is irrational behavior, erratic behavior, um, what I would call extreme swings and ups and downs like extremely up and chattery and overtly friendly, and then swings where her — her speech would be very slowed, incoherent, difficult to understand. She did express to me on three occasions that she had severe anger problems and asked if I would intervene on her behalf. She asked if I would pay for therapy for her. She told me that she really felt as though it was getting out of hand and I did offer to pay for the therapy for her.

I think that when the -- when we discovered that the gambling was going on and she was spending less and less time at home is when I really got concerned. And then of course, um, I had the unfortunate experience of my eight-year-old granddaughter complaining to me that Jamie left her in the car with the baby for long periods of time during the gambling episodes and so forth.

And then of course there was the instance where my granddaughter was quite upset about, um, drug

use that she had witnessed while with Jamie's family members.

- Q. Have you personally observed Jamie under the influence of alcohol?
  - A. Oh, yes, definitely.
- Q. Have you personally observed Jamie under the influence of drugs -- or -- or at times you believed she was?
- A. I would say so. Um, I can smell it on her at times, or again her speech is slow, her thinking is slow. I went to the home not long ago, I think two weeks ago, to pick up the eight-year-old granddaughter for a dental appointment. I arrived at the home at, um, I think it was 9:30 in the morning, the home was smelling of marijuana, she was smelling of marijuana. My granddaughter was still in bed, had not been gotten up or even dressed or anything for the dental appointment even though they'd been informed weeks ahead. So I left the home pretty shaken and really not knowing how to approach this whole thing.

And I would say for about three months the family as well as her friends have been discuss -- discussing a group drug intervention for Jamie because the entire family as well as her own friends feel as though it's time for intervention and drug rehab.

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- Now, have you observed Chris during the last ο. year since he and Jamie have been married, have you ever observed him to be drunk or what you consider to be under the influence or have a -- a -- use excessive alcohol?
- Well, I certainly observed him use excessive Α. alcohol the evening of his wedding.
  - But other than that. ο.
  - Ά. Um, no, I haven't.
- ο. Okay. And that -- and his wedding was approximately one year ago?
  - Α. One year ago.
- Okay. And does Chris, have you ever observed him to be under the influence of drugs?
  - No. Α.
  - Non-prescription drugs? 0.
  - Α. No.
- Now, Chris was in an accident some period of Q. time ago -- a car accident, is that accurate?
  - Α. Correct.
- And did -- what -- he receive a prescription ٥. for drugs -- or prescription drugs relative to his injuries?
- As far as I know, yes, there was a -- a few different times when he was on painkillers for his

injuries.

- Q. Did you -- have you observed him abusing that in any way?
  - A. No, I haven't.
- Q. Okay. Is there anything in your knowledge, um, that would give you concern about Sasha remaining with Chris in Chris' care?
- A. No. Again, I think that he's been an exemplary father. I think the fact that he, um, went through every hoop imaginable in Colorado with his last divorce and child custody, he was under the scrutiny I think of five court-appointed child psychologists, court advocate, special masters and so forth. He passed all of that with flying colors as did I -- I did as well. And every single one of the professionals came to the same conclusion which is why the -- the judge who ruled on the order provided such an extensive order for all future judges to review.
- Q. And in fact Chris has another child as you're referring to -- your -- another grandchild of yours?
  - A. Correct.
  - Q. And how old is she?
  - A. She is eight-years-old.
  - Q. And her name?
  - A. Her name is Sandra Haywood.

- Q. And does Sandra reside full-time with Chris?
- A. Correct.
- Q. And Chris has had full-time custody of her since she was what age?
- A. Um, she -- he obtained, um, full-custody in August I believe of 2004 and then it went through another cycle of hearings for a full year and I think it was 2005 that he then moved to -- to Montana by -- by the judge's ruling, asked that he be removed from the state so as to reduce the child's contact with the mother.
- Q. Okay. And regarding Jamie's ability to parent, do you have reasons for concern if the child would be placed with Jamie unsupervised?
- A. I would almost rather the child be with social services than to be with Jamie Miscampbell during her -- at her -- in her present condition. I'm sorry to say that because I do have a great deal of fondness for Jamie. I'm also someone who believes in a second chance for people and I would really like to see what kind of parenting Jamie would be capable of if indeed she had completed rehab and parenting instruction and so forth.

I've been told that she squeezes the child, shakes the child, throws the child on the bed. Um, my

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son has come to me weeping, literally distraught and upset as a result of not knowing what to do with Jamie's completely unacceptable parenting skills, just absolutely in -- unacceptable. But I would like to see her go through a drug rehab. Um, and it's not my personal interest to remove the child from her permanently. I would really like to see how she does once she has completed a -- a program.

- Q. Okay. Regarding, um -- again, Chris' employment and the stability, do you believe he has the -- and that you have the ability to continue that, um, for the indefinite future?
  - A. Oh, absolutely.
- Q. Okay. Do you have any intent to move or change your corporate headquarters or leave the Lakeside, Montana area?
- A. I don't, that's going to be my primary headquarters. If we end up franchising some of our spy enterprises we would have a corporate headquarters in Denver, but my home base will remain in Lakeside.

MS. JOHNSON-GILCHRIST: Okay. No further questions, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Cross-examine?

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#### CROSS-EXAMINATION

#### BY MR. MOORE:

- Q. Are you aware of your son's acts of violence that have been directed against Jamie Miscampbell?
  - A. No, I'm not.
  - O. You're not?
  - A. No, I'm not.
- Q. Are -- Were you aware of your son's acts of violence that were directed towards Kendell Strnak?
- A. Absolutely not, that was fabricated and proven to be so.
- Q. How about directed towards you? Hasn't your son acted violently towards you in the past?
- A. He has shouted at me certainly from time to time.
  - Q. Grabbed you by the neck once didn't he?
  - A. Absolute -- absolutely not.
  - Q. Okay.
  - A. Where this farfetched stuff comes from --
  - Q. Did you in fact attack your son one time?
  - A. Absolutely not.
  - Q. Scratch him across his face?
  - A. Absolutely not.
- Q. Uh-huh. Um, I noticed in the exhibits here there's a piece exerted out of a -- a website and it's

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entitled "Warning - This Woman is Dangerous," it's about you isn't it?

- That's right, it is.
- Okay. And you've exerted out one from Jamie, but there are lots of others on that website, aren't there?
- Yes, but they are all fabricated and most of Α. them are fictitious individuals and you might also want to be aware that we have a suit filed against this individual presently.
- Uh-huh. Well, so there's a lot of fabricated Ο. information on that website that says that you're a dangerous woman?
- Very fabricated. The individual you might Α. want to be apprised has been known to create tabloid publications in London and that's one of his past professions as tabloid publications.
- Why -- why do you suppose they'd go to all Q. that trouble if they didn't believe that?
- Um, because he has a lawsuit for which he's seeking meritless funds.
  - Okay. And in fact you've got --Q.
  - He's motivated entirely by financial gain. Α.
- You've got a number of civil lawsuits pending Q. against you right now, don't you?

A. They move out of a nonprofit that I had been a funder for some years, the nonprofit, um, I resigned from some five years ago. I funded them to the tune of probably over twenty thousand — twenty million dollars in the course of some 15 years.

Um, they are presently financially insolve -insolvent because the individuals cannot extract their,
you know, alleged funds from the nonprofit. They have
gone after me because I'm the one who has the funds.

- Q. Uh-huh. Okay. So there's one Cause No. DV-07-320(B), Matthew West versus Devra West, Chris Haywood?
  - A. Correct.
- Q. Okay. And that's a civil suit for \$25,000 for non --
  - A. That is for --
  - Q. Hey, let me finish my question.
  - A. Certainly.
- Q. That had to do with the building of a wraparound deck on your property?
  - A. Correct.
- Q. Okay. And that contractor's not been paid for the work he did?
- A. And he will not be paid either. The work was an absolute debauchery and we have photographs -- and

that is also a countersuit has been --

- O. Who hired that individual?
- A. I believe my -- my son, Chris, did.
- Q. Okay. There's another civil suit DV-07-239(C), Brazda and Life --
  - A. Correct.
- Q. -- and that's suing you for nonpayment of a note that was -- as I understand it's signed by --
  - A. It was for a note that I had co-signed on.
  - Q. Okay. For \$20,000 ---
  - A. Correct.
- Q. -- and that sum hasn't been paid either, has it?
- A. I was not informed that the individual had defaulted on that note, I was not informed until I received the petition.
- Q. Okay. Third one DV-07-271(A), this one has to do with the house that you supposedly were going to buy for in excess of two million dollars, is that correct?
  - A. Correct.
  - Q. Is that the house that you're in right now?
  - A. Correct.
- Q. In fact this lawsuit says that you're in there against the will of the seller and that you --

that you defaulted in the contract and in your agreement to make a down payment, is that correct?

- A. Um, that's -- information is incorrect and outdated.
- Q. Okay. So in spite of their demand that you leave the home for non-performance of your contractual agreement with them, you have remained and are requiring them to litigate this lawsuit against you?
- A. No, absolutely -- that is absolutely incorrect -- incorrect.
  - Q. Have you moved out?
  - A. Excuse me?
  - Q. Did you move out?
- A. I began -- we moved into the house on a lease option basis, we then determined a sell -- a buy/sell -- a normal buy/sell on the property. Two weeks before the closing on the property we discovered by -- by way of neighbors informing us, that there was a water dispute on a well, that there was also easement disputes of thirty feet easement onto the property that we had not been informed of, and the waterfront footage was less than half of what the real estate sale sheets had said to us. So we then enter -- entered into, I think, four to six weeks of negotiations and we were able to enter into a new buy/sell agreement for a

reduction of \$350,000 on the house in exchange for us not suing them for the nondisclosure. At this point we are still in contract, we have a storage contract on my personal belongings in the home and we're still due to close very shortly on the property. So I'm not out of contract on that property, I'm sorry to say.

- Q. But that lawsuit is still pending against you right now, is it not?
- A. Not to my knowledge because we -- and we have all this paperwork in right order to provide the Court if they should wish to see it.
  - O. What is the Circle of Divine Unity?
- A. Um, it was organization that was founded in the early '90's by the nonprofit that's sponsored my work from time to time.
- Q. And what did it do? What -- what was it's purpose?
- A. Well, they were supposed to have sponsored the work which I'm sorry to say did not do such a great job of it.
- Q. Okay. You were the director of that organization?
- A. I served on their board of director -- their board of directors for that for some period of time, I think five years or so.

THE COURT: I -- I do think that it does 15 16 not have much relevance. 1.7 EXHIBITS (Petitioner's Exhibit No. 6 admitted into 18 19 evidence.) 20 EXAMINATION 21 BY THE COURT: Ms. West, you stated that you went to pick 22 Ο. the child up -- the nine-year-old child up for -- to go 23 24 to the dentist at 9:30? 25 Correct.

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- Q. Where was Mr. Haywood?
- A. He was at work.
- Q. Where? I thought you said -- ···
- A. At my office location.
- Q. Where is your office location?
- A. In Lakeside.
- Q. Where in Lakeside?
- A. At the Village Commons commercial complex behind the Ace Hardware store.
  - Q. And you rent office space there?
- A. Correct, a three thousand square foot office suite.
- Q. Okay. The 50 -- 525 Political Hill is the -- the home that's involved in the lawsuit, correct?
- A. No, the home is not involved in the -- in the -
  I'm -- I'm unclear what -- which -- there's two

  properties in Lakeside, one is 38 Bayview --
- Q. Which is the one that -- that this Court was involved with, did a writ of possession, and the people allowed you to stay in that house, the two point some million dollar --
  - A. That one is 38 Bayview --
  - Q. That's 38 Bayview.
  - A. That's my home.
  - Q. Okay.

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- Α. The home that my son resides in is 525 Political Hill.
  - And -- and that home is owned by whom?
  - Α. Sanctuary Enterprises, my real estate L.L.C.
- So when you say that at 9:30 when you show -show up to go to the dentist, the house smelled like marijuana, correct?
  - Correct.
- And so that would have been from when your son was there also?
- No, he was not there. It was when the mother Α. was still in her pajamas and so forth and I -- I don't think it was uncommon for Jamie to be inebriated or high or whatever on marijuana early in the morning. I -it was very easy to tell when she was because her speech would slow and she would become far less alert and somewhat incoherent.
- You don't have any hint that maybe your son Q. was using marijuana in the morning also before he went to work?
- Well, I -- absolutely not, he would not have Ά. been able to perform his job I don't think if that had been the case.

a witness of lawful age, having been first duly sworn to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth, testified upon his oath as follows:

#### DIRECT EXAMINATION

#### BY MR. NEILL:

- Q. Please state your name and address, and spell your last name?
- A. Jeff Loflin, L-O-F-L-I-N, 21302 East Shore Route, Bigfork.
- Q. You were given a subpoena to appear here today, correct?
  - A. Yes.
  - Q. Do you know Chris and Jamie Haywood?
  - A. Yes.
  - Q. How do you know them?
- A. Um, when I moved up to Montana I met them at a restaurant and we've been friends ever since. Come to see me. We both have back injuries and I was on disability and we kind of just became friends that way.
  - Q. How long have you known Chris and Jamie?
  - A. I'd say three years -- about three or four

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years.

- Q. Okay. Do you interact with them socially?
- A. Yeah.
- Q. How often?
- A. Well, Che comes over -- Che and Jamie were coming over having barbecues at my house. Um, I've got a child now, so we just kind of get together and have barbecues and --
  - Q. By Che you mean Chris, right?
  - A. Yes.
  - Q. Che is a nickname for Chris?
  - A. Yes.
- Q. Okay. And have you seen Chris and Jamie interact with Sandra and Sasha?
  - A. Yes.
- Q. Okay. And what's your opinion of their parenting ability?
  - A. I think they're fantastic parents.
- Q. Okay. And have you ever seen either Chris or Jamie drink alcohol?
  - A. Yes.
- Q. Okay. Um, have you ever seen Chris drink to excess in your presence?
  - A. No.
  - Q. Okay. How often do you have beers or hang

out and drink with Chris?

- A. Um, I don't know, not very much anymore now that I have a child. Um, kind of doing the family thing so --
- Q. Have you ever been in Jamie's presence when you guys are drinking?
  - A. Yes.
- Q. Have you ever seen her drink too much in your opinion?
  - A. Not necessarily.
- Q. Okay. Have you ever seen her drink to excess?
  - A. Drink to -- excuse me?
- Q. Have you ever -- have you ever seen Jamie drink too much?
  - A. No.
- Q. Okay. You aware of Chris and Jamie ever getting into any -- any altercations when they're drinking?
- A. I've heard them argue, yeah. I'm not quite sure what starts it, if it might be alcohol involved.

  Um, I'd say it seems kind of petty if they argue.
  - Q. Okay.
  - A. Um, hearsay arguments.

- Q. Okay. Were you give a subpoena to appear here today?

  - A. Yes.
  - .. Q. How do you know her?
    - A. She's a friend through mutual friends.
- Q. Okay. Were you -- you were in fact a bridesmaid in her wedding, correct?
  - A. It was actually -- yes.
- Q. Okay. And have you interacted with her socially?
  - A. Uh-huh.
  - Q. On a fairly regular basis?

- A. Yeah.
- Q. How often do you interact with her?
- A. Um, see her maybe every few weeks.
- Q. Okay. Have you ever seen -- been with Jamie when she drinks?
  - A. Uh-huh.
  - Q. Okay. Have you ever seen her drink too much?
  - A. Uh-huh.
  - Q. How often have you witnessed that?
- A. Um, actually the last time I was with her -or the time before that, sorry, she was -- had been
  drinking too much, and she ended up driving me home and
  I ended up calling Che and telling him that if she
  wasn't home by a certain time to be worried 'cause I
  thought she had too much.
  - Q. Okay. When was this?
  - A. Around May 12th.
- Q. Okay. Um, on that night were -- was there anybody else in the car at that time?
  - A. No.
- Q. Okay. Have you seen Jamie drink and drive any other times?
  - A. Yes.
  - Q. How often?
  - A. Um, maybe once or twice before.

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- Okay. Has she ever done that with her kids Q. in the car?

a witness of lawful age, having been first duly sworn to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth, testified upon his oath as follows:

# DIRECT EXAMINATION

# BY MR. NEILL:

- Q. Please state and spell your name for the record, please?
- A. It's Geoffrey Reynolds and that's G-E-O-F-F-R-E-Y, and Reynolds, R-E-Y-N-O-L-D-S.
- Q. Were you given a subpoena to appear here today?
  - A. Yes, sir, I did.
- Q. Would you please state your occupation and place of employment?
- A. I am the financial manager for Surya Enterprises Unlimited in Lakeside.
  - Q. Okay. What is Surya Enterprises?
- A. It is a production company that produces audio CDs and sells them to the general public as well as a start up for a health and healing spa.
  - Q. Okay. And who owns that company?
  - A. Devra West does.
  - Q. Okay. How long have you been working for

that company?

- A. Since September of 2006.
- Q. Okay. What's your -- briefly, what's your education and training?
- A. I am -- I've got a degree in accounting and computers from Cal-Poly in California, a CPA from California and have been working for a CPA firm -- I was a partner for 15 years before I went out on my own into individual companies -- start up companies.
  - Q. Okay. Do you know Chris Haywood?
  - A. Yes, I do.
  - Q. Okay. How do you know him?
- A. Well, he's the son of my -- my boss and he works for us at the company. And his daughter and my daughter go to school together. So we've gotten to know each other through the kids' association.
- Q. Okay. By his daughter, you mean Sandra, his eight-year-old?
  - A. Sandra, correct, the older daughter.
  - Q. Okay. How long have you known Chris?
- A. Well, I've known Chris since September when I first got here, but I've really gotten to know Chris since about January.
  - Q. Okay.
  - A. That's when our kids got together.

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- Q. Okay. And from your observations is -- is Chris a good father?
- Every time I have been with Chris and been Α. with the children together, Chris has been an exceptional father. He's been very understanding. He -he handles the children very well and they listen to him and obey him. And he's, you know, like I said he's been a very good father with me -- I'd have no problem leaving my children with him.
- Okay. Um, is -- is Sandra fairly well Q. behaved to your -- in your opinion?
- My wife made a comment, she said "I wish my daughter behaved as well as Sandra does."
  - Okay. Um, do you know Jamie Haywood? Ο.
- Not really, I do know her. She came to work Α. for us for a short period of time, so --
- Okay. You know that she's Chris' wife, Ο. correct?
  - Α. Yes.
- Okay. Um, you mentioned she -- she came to Q. work for you, can you explain when that was?
- She came to work for us at the end of Α. February -- the 23rd of February as a consultant to do cleaning in the office. Um, she worked for us on and off for about three weeks. She'd show up for work --

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or she'd show up late. Um, sometimes she'd call, sometimes she wouldn't, so it was about three weeks -and then there was no formal termination but she quit coming and I quit calling, so --

- Okay. So you said -- so it was about three weeks that she worked?
- Yeah, three or four weeks, I'm not exactly Α. sure of the timeframe --
  - Okay. Q.
- -- because it was -- we were busy doing a lot of things at that point.
- Okay. And did you -- you say she wasn't Q. officially terminated, you just -- can you --
- Well, we didn't -- you know, I'm -- I'm --Α. she's the wife of the owner's son, so she came into work for us. She was supposed to be doing office cleaning. I didn't enforce the rules on her like I would a normal employee. If she'd been a normal employee, I probably would have fired her after two weeks.
- Okay. Have you ever interacted with Jamie socially outside of work?
- No, not really. Just a couple of times I've Α. run into her at the house when I was over to -- to meet Devra for some reason.

I have no -- no way to judge that. I did -like I said I never really interfaced with her outside of work.

MR. NEILL: Okay. No more questions.

MR. MOORE: I have no questions.

THE COURT: You may step down.

MS. JOHNSON-GILCHRIST: And Petitioner's next witness will be Chris Haywood. Thereupon,

## CHRIS HAYWOOD,

a witness of lawful age, having been first duly sworn to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth, testified upon his oath as follows:

## DIRECT EXAMINATION

## BY MS. JOHNSON-GILCHRIST:

- And would you state your name for the record, Q. please?
  - Chris William Haywood. Α.
- And you're the -- you're the Petitioner in ο. this matter?
  - Yes, ma'am. Α.

- Q. And your nickname that people have been referring to you as?
  - A. Che.
  - Q. And how do you spell that?
  - A. C-H-E.
- Q. And, Chris, you filed an affidavit herein prepared by our office and you're familiar with the terms of that?
  - A. Yes, ma'am.
  - Q. And you provided the information for that?
  - A. Yes, ma'am.
- Q. And essentially, um, you and Jamie have been married for approximately one year and you have an approximately one-year-old child, correct?
  - A. Yes, ma'am.
- Q. Okay. And could you -- um, first of all relate to the Court what is your health, there's some reference to you have some health issues, what's the -- what's the background of that?
- A. Um, I was injured in a car accident, um, about two-and-a-half years ago which left my hip with limited mobility. Um, I have rib problems, shoulder problems, back problems, but I'm getting steadily better. Um, it has been difficult for me to go through my healing with the situation that is in my home right

Q. Okay. And are you currently, um, physically able to care for a one-year-old child?

- A. Yes, ma'am.
- Q. Okay. And during the last year since Sasha was born, were you involved in her care on a daily basis?
  - A. Yes, ma'am.
- Q. And describe what you did as far as your care giving for Sasha?
- A. Well, Sasha wakes up about 8:30 in the morning. Um, normally we will try to feed her directly after she wakes up. Um, after feeding she will get a bath. Um, then she'll play for maybe an hour to hour and a half. Around ten o'clock, um, is normally her first nap, she usually sleeps anywhere from an hour to two hours. Um, get up, feed her again around noon. Um, then she'll play again for several hours until about four o'clock. At four o'clock she'll normally take another nap. Um, and then dinner and, um, normally she goes to sleep about nine o'clock.
- Q. Okay. And have you been involved in the schedule and care giving on a daily basis since her birth?
  - A. Absolutely. The only time that I have

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voluntarily been away from my daughter is when I went to my grandfather's funeral.

- Okay. Now, has Jamie also been involved in Q. her care?
  - To her -- best of her ability. Α.
- Okay. And did Jamie -- has she stayed at ο. home with her since she was born?
- Um, Jamie went -- she tried to go to work at Α. Cattleman's Casino when Sasha was three months old.
  - And what was the reason for that? Ο.
- Um, after she quit breast feeding, um, she Α. seemed to be very, very restless and wanted to get out and about, and continue on with her -- with her life. Um, she, um went to work there for -- I think it was about three weeks. Um, and that's about the time when her behavior started changing. Um, her drinking started becoming in -- in excess. Um, that was pretty much where I'd be -- I believed that, um, her drug problem returned.
- Now, during the times that Jamie was gone working, um, outside the home, who cared for Sasha?
  - I did. Α.
- Did you ever hire any type of regular third-Q. party care giver?
  - Α. No, ma'am.

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- Okay. Now, is your schedule and -- and what Q. you do for your employment for your mother's company, um, is that something you can do from home?
- Yes, ma'am. In fact most of the work that I've done so far has been on the home that I live in, so it -- it is -- I'm -- I'm right there.
- And is it something you can continue to do Q. from home for the -- say the next six months or a year?
- The next year is my -- my project for the next year will be at the neighboring house which belongs to my mother -- or she's purchasing. Um, that will be my next project, so it's -- it's literally a rock throw away.
- Are you able to schedule what you need to do Ο. around, um, Sasha's care?
  - Yes, ma'am. Α.
  - Now, you have another child? Q.
  - I do. Α.
  - And her name is Sandra? Ο.
  - Sandra Dawn Haywood. Α.
- And you heard your mother testify that you Q. have had full time custody of her since approximately 2004?
  - Yes, ma'am. Α.
  - Would you refer to what's marked as Q.

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Petitioner's Exhibit 1? And is this a true and correct copy of the order from Colorado relative to the custody of your child?

- Yes, it is.
- And in fact the Court in Colorado also allowed you to bring your daughter, Sandra, to Montana and relocate here?
- Yes, ma'am. Jurisdiction was transferred to Α. Montana.
- Okay. And did you undergo numerous types of Q. testing, evaluation and so on in that proceeding?
- Um, originally we were assigned a special advocate and also ordered a psychological evaluation done by a psychologist. Um, the mother of my, um, eldest daughter then had the first special advocate -or tried to have the first ad -- special advocate removed and became so disruptive that the lady asked to be removed from the case. We were then as -- assigned another special advocate by the name of Gail Adams, the same exact thing happened with that lady. Then we were assigned a special master who's name was Marsha Murphy who did the custody evaluation. Um, she was also -she tried to remove her also several times, um, but eventually through the documentation of this special master's special advocates, um, I was awarded full

custody.

- Q. Okay. And you provide the regular every day care for your daughter, Sandra, is that correct?
  - A. I do.
- Q. Now, what was Jamie's -- what is Jamie's relationship or care giving toward Sandra, and if you have any reasons for concern, could you please relate that to the Court?
- A. Um, when I first met Jamie, she was extremely friendly with Sash -- with Sandra. She was very helpful. Um, I -- you know, I -- I would have great hopes for Jamie's ability to be a mother. Um, I really -- um, I really thought that things were going to be different.

Um, when -- while she was pregnant she wasn't drinking, her behavior was a lot calmer. I really had a lot of -- a lot of hope. Um, but when the baby was born, um, she seemed to be very, very overwhelmed. Um, both physically, mentally, emotionally, um, she seemed as though she was unable to handle the -- the -- she was unable to handle the job.

- Q. And then since Jamie started going back to work, has her relationship with Sandra changed?
- A. Um, yes. She began to be very, um, mean. She was verbally abusive. My daughter began to, um,

discuss with me that -- that -- that she wasn't liking the way that she was treated.

Um, we had arguments about it. Um, I'm extremely protective of my oldest daughter, she was my first daughter, so that really doesn't go over real good for me.

- Q. Were there incidents where Jamie would leave Sandra in the car or take her with her and leave her in the car --
  - A. It -- it --
  - Q. -- as your mom stated gambling episodes?
- A. Yes, ma'am. Um, my daughter came to me and -- and explained to me that, um --

MR. MOORE: Your Honor, I guess I'd object that this is going to be a hearsay statement.

THE COURT: Sustained.

MS. JOHNSON-GILCHRIST: Okay.

- Q. (BY MS. JOHNSON-GILCHRIST) Were there incidents that the children were left unattended in the car that you're aware of?
  - A. Yes, ma'am.
- Q. And at the time is it your understanding that Jamie was gambling?
  - A. Yes. She bribed my daughter not to tell me.
  - O. Um, now --

MS. JOHNSON-GILCHRIST: First of all, Your Honor, I want to move for admission of Petitioner's Exhibit 1, that was the order from Colorado re -- regard -- granting Mr. Haywood custody of his oldest daughter.

MR. MOORE: I have no objection.

THE COURT: 1 is admitted.

#### EXHIBITS

(Petitioner's Exhibit No. 1 admitted into evidence.)

MS. JOHNSON-GILCHRIST: Okay.

- Q. (BY MS. JOHNSON-GILCHRIST) And, Chris, specifically regarding the separation that led to this proceeding and filing of your affidavit, um, what happened -- or was there an incident that happened before that when Jamie left that, um --
  - A. Um --
- Q. -- in your words what happened? There's an incident that's in question.
- A. Well, there -- there have been, um, a couple of ins -- incidents over the last few months that I've -- have led me to believe that, um, our marriage was failing. Um, but the last particular incident, um, involved, um, while -- while we were driving in a car.
  - Q. And when was that?

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- Um, I believe that was the 22<sup>nd</sup>. Α.
- Of June? Q.
- Yes, ma'am. Α.
- And could you relate to the Court what happened that evening?
- Well, um, we had gone to Mr. Loflin's home for dinner. Um, they had just moved into a new home and so we brought them a bottle of wine for a housewarming gift. Um, when I got there, um, he asked if I would take a ride with him to his aunt's house which is a few farms away. Um, when I returned we ate dinner. Um, we left. Um, while we were driving home, she began driving erratically through downtown Kalispell. Um, I started asking her to slow down to -um, we started arguing about how fast she was driving. Um, she got on --
  - Were the children in the car with you? Q.
- Both of the children were in the car. she -- we got out on to 93, um, about where the, um, Toyota store is there on 93. Um, she just looked over to me, you know, with a very crazy look on her face. Um, started -- put her foot onto the gas pedal, um, refused to take it off 'til the car was doing over 90 miles an hour.

At that point I was yelling, begging to her

to slow down, my children started to yell. Um, we got up -- up over, um, the Somer's hill where I finally got her to pull over. Um, as soon as she pulled over, um, she punched me in the mouth. Um, at that time I put my hands together and just started praying to God that she would stop because my children were very scared, I was scared and I don't know how to handle her when -- when she's, um -- I -- it -- it seems like possessed, like she's -- there's no -- nothing that I can do to -- to stop it,

- Q. Did you --
- A. -- no reasoning --
- Q. Did you strike her?
- A. No, ma'am.
- Q. Did you choke her?
- A. No, ma'am.
- Q. Did -- what happened after that?
- A. Well, um, she -- she hit me when I placed my hands like this (indicating), began praying. She began pulling her hair out, stamping her feet and hitting herself which is something that I've seen in the past, she -- when she gets very angry she will, um, hurt herself. Um, she has cuts on her own arms that she put on herself.
  - Q. Self-mutilation type?

A. Yes, ma'am.

- Q. Now, had Jamie been drinking that evening?
- A. Um, it later became aware to me that she had drank the whole bottle of wine that we had brought to Mr. Loflin's home which was a liter bottle of wine.

  Um, she drank the entire bottle.
  - Q. While the two of you were gone to his --
  - A. Yes, ma'am.
  - Q. -- to pick up furniture?
  - A. Yes, ma'am.
  - Q. Then what happened the following day?
- A. Um, well, we drove home first. Um, when we got to the home, um, she was really belligerent. Um, she picked up a ten inch kitchen knife, um, began waving it around. Um, was saying that she was going to stab herself, when I wouldn't -- I -- I was afraid to get near her with the knife. She began stabbing it into my Corian countertops. Um, at that point I took Sasha and started heading towards the door. Um, she threw the cab -- cable channel clicker at me which then made a hole in the wall near the door. Um, I went outside for a little while. She finally calmed down. Um, I brought the baby back in, put the baby in the crib. We argued a little bit more and then Jamie passed out in -- on the floor of the -- of my eldest --

or my youngest daughter's room.

Um, the next morning, um, it seemed as though she didn't remember what had happened. Um, she got together a grocery list, said that she was going to go to the grocery store. Um, I was going boating with my youngest daughter and -- she never came back.

- Q. How long did you search for her or try to find her before you took legal action?
- A. Well, that -- that -- about midnight that night. Um, a friend of hers, boyfriend, called me looking for her, said, you know, "have you seen Sophie?" I said, "No, that I hadn't seen Sophie, I hadn't seen Jamie." Um, the following morning he called back again, said, you know, "I haven't seen Sophie, have you seen them?" Um, at that point I pretty much gathered that she was out partying with -- with Sophie. Um --
  - Q. Were you able to contact her?
- A. Um, she -- she'd turned off her cell phone. At that point I'd never was able to speak with her, um, until after the protective order was in place and then she called my home -- or called my cell phone to check on Sasha.
  - Q. And that was a -- she had Sasha with her?
  - A. I had -- when I --

- Q. No, for the -- for that interim period she had Sasha with her?
- A. Um, I have information that she in -intermediately had Sasha, that she was, um, passing
  Sasha off to various family members and friends.
  - Q. But Sasha was not with you, she was with --
  - A. No, ma'am. I did not --
- Q. -- or under her mother's care or someone under her direction.
- A. I was not able to see my daughter for -- for about ten days.
- Q. Then, um, you stated in the protective order that you have concerns about Jamie and methamphetamine use?
  - A. Yes, ma'am.
  - O. What is the basis for those concerns?
- A. Jamie has in the past had a serious methamphetamine problem. Um, her teeth are rotting out of her head. Um, her behavior, um, I -- I think it's an example of somebody who used methamphetamine at a very young age. I think it has -- has seriously damaged her. Um --
- Q. How do you know -- or what -- who gave you the information that Jamie had a meth problem?
  - A. She did.

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- Q. And beginning at what age?
- A. 15.
- Q. Um, was she ever arrested for possession of drugs?
- A. Um, her and a fellow named Jerry Hines were arrested for possession of, um, methamphetamine and illegal firearms.
  - O. And how old was she then?
  - A. I believe she was 17.
- Q. Did, um -- was she ever convicted of any such offense?
- A. The gentleman was -- was convicted of the crime, she was 17 at the time.
  - Q. Did he go to jail?
  - A. He did -- he was in prison for five years.
- Q. Um, when -- when you were looking for Jamie, where were you looking for her? Where did you believe her to be during this ten day period?
- A. Um, I was calling her, I wasn't looking for her. I, um, I -- I was calling her mom's house, I was calling the cell phone, I was calling friends if they had seen her. Um, I wasn't actively looking for her.
  - Q. Physically looking for her.
  - A. Physically looking for her.
  - Q. Now, do you have concerns if Jamie's at her

mother's home?

- A. Yes, ma'am.
- Q. And isn't that the address she has used in the order -- or request for order of protection she filed in Justice Court?
  - A. Yes, that is her mom's home.
- Q. And is it true that her mother has been convicted of offenses relating to drugs?
  - A. She has been convicted of multiple offenses.
- Q. Did her mother in fact serve time in prison for drug related offenses?
  - A. Yes, ma'am.
- Q. Does she also have an uncle that was -- has been or has resided in the home and Jamie's had contact with?
- A. Um, her uncle and her mother were both arrested in the home while all the children were there. Her uncle was arrested for two pounds of cocaine, her mom was arrested for five pounds of marijuana. Um, the children were there, witnessed the whole situation, watched the sheriff's department dig up their plumbing because they -- the uncle was trying to flush it down the toilet. Um --
- Q. Okay. And did the uncle serve time in prison for drugs?

- A. Yes, ma'am, eight years.
- Q. And do any of Jamie's friends you're aware of have problems with drugs?
  - A. Yes.
- Q. Or vi -- or violent behavior and could you relate those?
- A. Yeah. Most all of her friends have drug problems. Um, most all of their associations, um, are somebody who uses drugs.

Um, one in particular friend, um, is in the courtroom right now. Um, she has just gotten out of -- or out of some type of detention home or something like that for, um, beating her boyfriend with a baseball bat.

- Q. Now, there were -- was a statement made by your mother about concerns about gambling and using funds. Could you please relate to the Court when this occurred, how recently and what the concerns were about the gambling?
- A. Um, well, I became aware of it about three months ago. Um, but going back through my bank statements, it's been happening for a long time. But, um, basically I have money in -- we have money in a -- a savings account, and money in a checkings account.

  And I -- over the last, um, three months I've paid

 Q. Not the amount, just -- but just the overdraft charges?

twenty-six hundred dollars in, um, overdraft fees --

- A. That's the overdraft fees because she -- I have control over the savings, so, um, she would -- would not want to explain to me that she had withdrawn all the money out of the account. I am paying the bills with a debit card, um, and so as a result of my not knowing that she has withdrawn the cash, um, the overdraft fees, you know, were -- were a -- when I went into the bank, it was clear to them that she was withdrawing it as fast as I could put it in there.
- Q. Have you had a problem in addition to the gambling and alcohol and drugs you have related with Jamie lying?
- A. Yes, um, it's become to my knowledge that she had been borrowing money from her mom and telling her mom that we needed money for bills. And Jamie has never paid any bills in our home or to my knowledge borrowed any money from anybody to pay our bills. Um, there was a situation about a year and a half ago where Jamie paid to have her mother's teeth fixed because her mother's teeth had fallen out. Um, and she paid for it, I -- I was kind of irritated about because I didn't think that that was fair because her own teeth are

falling out too. Um, it later became to my knowledge that it was in repayment for loans that she said that she was paying bills at my home -- at my previous home which is absolutely true -- not true, she'd never paid any bills there.

So I have developed the history of lying about money mostly -- lying about money, lying about where she's at, lying about who she's hanging out with, lying about where she's at.

- Q. Now, regarding the parenting plan that you have requested the Court to adopt herein, you have stated that you want Jamie to have only supervised visits until there has been a -- an investigation and drug and alcohol testing?
  - A. Yes, ma'am.
  - Q. And that is still your opinion today?
  - A. Yes, ma'am.
- Q. And do you think that that is in Sasha's best interest?
  - A. Yes, ma'am.
- Q. Now, um, what has happened because this is something that I think the Court would want to know in that you -- you married this girl -- you obviously had a relationship with her, you married her and then, um, the two of you have been raising your daughter in your

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marital home, there was no supervised -- court ordered supervised visitation now -- but now you're asking the Court to impose this. Would you please relate to the Court why you think that's appropriate, what's changed?

- Well, um, during her pregnancy she -- she did beautifully, she -- her behavior was good. Um, you know, I -- I very much love her. Um, but it has come clear that I cannot help her in the situation that she is with the influences of her family members. Um, I --I, you know, the meth problem is something that's much bigger than what I can do. I -- I -- she needs professional help.
- And in your mind are you convinced that Jamie has a drug and alcohol problem?
- Oh, absolutely, a serious alcohol problem and a serious drug problem.
- Has she made any statements to you since, um, in the last week, since you got Sasha in your care, have you had conversations with her and has she made any statements to you relating to that?
- Yes, ma'am. Um, she was trying to, um, make Α. me feel guilty for having Sasha. Um, I explained to her that, um, you know, if -- if she would get her -- self some help that things would change. Um, she said that she would pass a urinary test because she would drink a

-- a detox tea and vinegar. Um, I -- I said that I would request not a urinalysis test that I wanted a hair test and she said that she would shave her head and hung up on me.

- Q. Did she deny that she was using?
- A. No.
- Q. Now, I would like to go through, um, some of the exhibits and marked -- what's marked as Petitioner's Exhibit No. 2, and can you identify this, please?
- A. This is a sworn statement, um, written by

  Jamie Miscampbell, um, admitting lying to police

  officers, lying to court officials and apologizing for,

  um, misrepresenting facts.
- Q. And in fact in this there are two statements -two separate statements that she signed under oath -sworn statements that she admitted she lied?
  - A. It says flat out I lied about what happened.
- Q. And is this relating to an incident about five -- four years ago in -- three and a half, four years ago in Colorado?
  - A. Yes, ma'am.
- Q. And very, very briefly, um, were you charged with an assault charge?
  - A. Originally based on her very first statement.

1	Q. And she later retracted her statement, is
2	that correct, and the charges were dropped?
3	A. Yes.
4	Q. And she admitted she had lied?
5	A. Yes.
6	Q. And these are copies of the two letters that
7	she signed and submitted to the court in Colorado to
8	get the charges dismissed?
9	A. Yes.
10	Q. Did you in fact hit her as she had originally
11	alleged?
12	A. No, ma'am. I've never hit her.
13	MS. JOHNSON-GILCHRIST: Move for admission
14	of Petitioner's Exhibit No. 2.
15	MR. MOORE: I have no objection, Your
16	Honor.
17	THE COURT: 2 is admitted.

21	Q. (BY MS. JOHNSON-GILCHRIST) And relating to
22	Exhibit No. 3, Chris is this a true and correct copy of

25	A. Yes, it is.

1	Q. And is this the judgment and sentence
2	relative to her mother's drug conviction?
3	A. Yes, it is.
4	MS. JOHNSON-GILCHRIST: Move for admission
5	of Exhibits 3 and 4.
6	MR. MOORE: I have no objection, Your
7	Honor.
8	THE COURT: 3 and 4 are admitted.
9	EXHIBITS

12	Q. (BY MS. JOHNSON-GILCHRIST) And No. 5
13	relating or can you identify this and how you
14	obtained that?
15	A. No. 5?
16	Q. Yes.
17	A. Um, well, I I did a search on the computer
18	to find out what her police record is. Um, and I
19	believe that this is the search that your office did.
20	Q. No, Exhibit 5, I think you're on 4.
21	A. Oh, this is a e-mail from Jamie Miscampbell
22	or Jamie Haywood to the individual who has been
23	harassing my mom with the internet stuff.
24	Q. And at the last paragraph on the first page,
25	um, there are statements there regarding a spell your

mother put on her and your 11 month old daughter?

- A. Yes, ma'am. She claims that she feels like she is going crazy, that a spell has been casted on her forehead and in her stomach and that a spell has been cast on my daughter's internal organs, but that a spiritual person has removed it from her and that she's going to be okay.
- Q. And do you -- this is -- or it indicates it was posted by Jamie Haywood?
  - A. Yes, ma'am.
- Q. Do you have any reason to doubt that this was written by Jamie?
  - A. I believe it was written by Jamie.
- MS. JOHNSON-GILCHRIST: Move for admission of Petitioner's 5.

MR. MOORE: No objection.

THE COURT: 5 is admitted.
